
## Crafty Ladies



The Arc of Somerset has been a gift to, not only Eric, but his whole family. They have taught him many things that we never dreamed he would learn. He has an amazing housemate who keeps us up to date on Eric's progress and watches him like a brother. The staff who takes care of all Eric's needs are always helpful and always very friendly to our family. In our experience, the Arc has been a blessing.

Every step of the process of placing him is in his Arc home, and then with his daily care, has been a positive one. Thank you to all who take care of Eric and keep him happy. We are






## Shooting the Breeze with Friends

All,

Dear Friends, Family and Supporters,

It has been a full two years since we were affected by the Corona Virus Pandemic. This has been a long journey, and we are feeling cautiously optimistic regarding the decreasing levels of infection in our area.

We have received notification from The Department of Human Services regarding our current protocols of screening, masking and social distancing. In summary the following will be observed:

#### Screening:

- All staff, visitors, guests, contractors and other parties must screen prior to entering any Arc facility
- Temperature screening is the only requirement for those up to date with vaccines/ boosters
- Temperature screening and answering 3 questions is required for those non up to date with vaccine/boosters
   Individuals served will all be screened prior to entering a day program

#### Masking:

- Masking will be based on personal preference if the individual is up to date on Vaccines/ Boosters
- Making will be required indoors if the individual is not up to date on Vaccines/ boosters
   Masking will be required for all staff members during the transporting of individuals

#### Visits:

- All visitors, guests contractors, employees MUST screen prior to entering a day program or residential facility
- Visits which take place indoors require masks for the visitor regardless of vaccine status Visits which take place outdoors masking will be based on personal preference

#### Risk assessment:

• The Arc reserves the right to require masks when working with individuals who are considered immunocompromised or at higher risk for health issue related to COVID - 19

The Arc will monitor the NJ Community Covid-19 levels and will adjust our protocols accordingly.

We look forward to seeing everyone this spring as we start our transition into the endemic phase of Covid-19!
