Construction Zone Safety



Summary

 \succ some final reminders to recall when you will be traveling though work zones on your trip:

• Check before heading out on a trip to determine whether there are work zones along your route, or if heavy traffic congestion is causing delays due to work zones

- Allow extra time to reach your destination
- Observe the posted speed limit
- Use your signals and mirrors when merging
- Try to merge early avoid last minute, aggressive moves
- Leave extra room in front of your vehicle in case traffic suddenly stops
 Pay attention to the roadway conditions and to flaggers

> Share the right-of-way with vehicles merging into your lane (be patient and aware of folks trying to merge at the last possible moment)

➤ Watch for construction workers who may be dangerously close to traffic ➤ Stay alert and drive cautiously as many state's fines may double in work zones
