Jerry Davis Center Accepted into State Pilot Project

The Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families has been accepted into GrowNJ Kids, a New Jersey pilot project that will become a gateway for programs to easily access specialized and/or individualized training, technical assistance and support, and professional development for teachers and caregivers. The pilot includes 60 programs currently providing center-based early care and education programs in Essex, Middlesex, Morris, and Somerset Counties.

Nationally, there are over 26 states that either have a quality rating and improvement system or are in the development process. In keeping with national standards, GrowNJ Kids' core elements will include program and practitioner standards, health and safety standards, family engagement and consumer education, as well as provider support and accountability measures. GrowNJ Kids will provide staff with specialized training

and demonstrate a center's quality to parents. The data from the project will help New Jersey determine "how the children are doing," and provide valuable information about high quality early experiences to parents, families, and the community.

In preparation for the project, JDCCF staff has already attended training on the nationally-recognized, evidence-based *Creative Curriculum*. "Many of our local school districts are already using the *Creative Curriculum*," remarked Jennifer Orlick, Director of Children & Family Services. "Therefore, we decided to also change to these learning strategies to better prepare our students for kindergarten." Additionally, Jennifer is currently attending the Child Care Center Directors Academy, a 60+hour course that includes topics important to quality center management. Course objectives are geared to boost the innovation and success of New Jersey's daycare system leaders.

The Fund was created through generous contributions from Dr. Diana Zuckerman, Dr. Barry Zuckerman, and Mr. & Mrs. Fred & Roe Patterson, and its purpose is to support healthy living and recreational opportunities for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

The Fund is named in honor of the late Leo and Anne Zuckerman, two of the first parents and founding trustees of The Arc of Somerset County. Leo, a longtime Johnson & Johnson employee, was responsible

for the groundbreaking discovery of the Rh factor, which paved the way for the prevention of many disabilities. In addition to his career with Johnson & Johnson, he and his wife Anne were very active with The Arc of Somerset County. Leo and Anne had three children: Diana, the Executive Director of the National Center for Policy Research for Women and Families in Washington, DC; Barry, the Chair of Pediatrics and Professor of Public Health at the Boston University School of Medicine; and Elliot, who





Camp Jotoni "Goes Green" with Rain Barrel Project



n July 11th, campers and counselors at Camp Jotoni built rain barrels during a "Build A Rain Barrel" workshop sponsored by the Rutgers New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station (NJAES). Pat Rector, the NJAES representative for Somerset and Morris Counties,

held an interactive discussion with the group about the purpose of rain barrels and their impact on the environment. Afterwards, teams comprised of counselors and campers worked together on the complex tasks of installing the spout, overflow hose adapter, and mosquito screen in 15 rain barrels. Members of the Rutgers Master Gardeners of Somerset and Hunterdon Counties, who have sponsored a horticulture program at camp for the last 5 years, were there to lend a hand.



"New experiences such as this can have a positive impact on the individuals we serve," remarked Lauren Panarella, Executive Director, "including providing the opportunity to work as a team, to learn something new, to possibly discover a hidden talent, to feel a sense of accomplishment, and to enhance self-esteem."

Camp will keep one rain barrel to water the herb, vegetable, and flower gardens planted by the Master Gardeners. The remaining barrels will be auctioned off at a Community Day Event at Camp Jotoni on Saturday, September 28th (rain date: Sunday, September 29th). Members of the community will have the opportunity to visit camp and learn about all the services provided by The Arc of Somerset County. Grants and Donations Provide Program Support

The Bishop Janes United Methodist Church of Basking Ridge donated \$1,000 to The Arc of Somerset County. This is The Arc's first contribution from the church.

The Franklin Township Community Development Block Grant Program has awarded The Arc with a grant of \$21,150 to fund accessibility renovations to a bathroom in the Griggstown Group Home.

The Green Knoll Ladies Golf League donated \$775 to Camp Jotoni. The funds were raised through the club's spring luncheon.

Janssen Pharmaceuticals awarded The Arc with a \$2,500 grant to support Camp Jotoni.

The Knights of Columbus Councils #6573 (St. Jude), #11409 (Warren), and #13264 (Raritan) raised \$871, \$2,000, and \$2,610 respectively for The Arc through their annual fund drives.

The Union Foundation awarded The Arc with a \$5,000 grant to support accessibility projects at Camp Jotoni.

June 27 – Dennis and Mary Downs, parents of a camper, along with 10 friends cleaned and painted cabin floors and installed a fence at Camp Jotoni.
