On Wednesday, October 5, 2022, The Manville Public Library hosted an opening reception for the Fall Art Exhibit of artwork created by individuals served by The Arc of Somerset County. The artwork was completed in conjunction with staff from Therapeutic Recreation Program (TR Program). The show featured art pieces created at TR Program's office as well as pieces completed with TR Program staff at The Arc's Camplain Road and Jill Court Day Hab locations. Reception attendees were treated to piano music performed by Justin Brown while viewing the masterpieces.

A variety of mediums and art styles were used including popsicle sticks, crayons, watercolor, Perler beads, mosaics-art where the surface is covered by small pieces of objects, string art in the shape of leaves, CDs and even toilet paper used for paper texture painting.

One of the highlights of the show was a set of wings made up of individual feathers colored by the artists. Reception attendees had the opportunity to pose in front of the wings for a photo. Also present were Photo Self-Portraits that included a photo of the individual as well as clip art and/or photos of things they enjoy every day on watercolor backdrops. This projects provides an insight of who the artist is.

Gwen from TR Program noted these projects are about enjoying the action of making the art, not the end result. During the sessions individuals are encouraged to think creatively. The Therapeutic Recreation Program, a program of the Somerset County Park Commission, is dedicated to providing year round recreation and leisure opportunities for people with developmental disabilities.
