## Camp Jotoni Fundraising Cabin Renovation Update

As the 2018 year comes to a close, The Arc of Somerset County and Camp Jotoni are so very proud to share an update on our Camp Jotoni Capital Campaign! This year we have made great progress towards meeting our goal to create updated facilities that will meet the unique needs of our campers.

To date, we have:

1. Raised over $\$ 471,000$
2. Hosted our first "Clubs for Cabins" Golf Outing in September generating over \$90k
3. Solidified financing options with local banks
4. Planned to begin breaking ground for the first TWO cabins in 2019!

The funds that were raised have made significant impact toward the first phase of obtaining the means needed to upright the first 2 cabins of 4 planned.

## Phase 2:

In the coming 2019 calendar year, The Arc Foundation of Somerset County will be continuing the outreach for support to help fulfill the funding for Cabins $3 \& 4$.

With each cabin built, our special needs children, adults and their families will benefit for utilizing Camp Jotoni's respite programs 12 months of the year, respite care will expand beyond the 9 week summer, and overnight respite will be available more frequently for our growing list of registered special needs families.

## Phase 3:

Upon cabins 3 \& 4 completion, we will focus on to the construction of "The Lodge", which will host Camp Jotoni's cafeteria, classrooms, indoor activity room, after school program and camp counselor and nurse's offices.

We look forward to celebrating this next step in the history of Camp Jotoni's renovation plan and hope that you will join us at our official groundbreaking ceremony in 2019!

## Early intervention and Daycare Proves Successful for Toddler with Developmental Delays

F ajr enrolled in The Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families (JDCCF) at the beginning of the fall session. Fajr is a beautiful 2 year old child with a diagnosis of Emanuel Syndrome- a chromosomal disorder causing a severe, global delay in all areas of growth. She was unable to crawl, walk, stand, feed herself or interact at an age appropriate level.

Since October, JDCCF and Early Intervention Services has helped Fajr with an integrated inclusive program which has demonstrated some major progress. Currently, Fajr is interacting with her peers by smiling, at times laughing, and making friendly eye contact with them when they approach her to play and help her with skill building activities. Fajr brightens up the Daycare program every day. "It makes me so happy to see Fajr enjoying her school day, playing and learning along with all her peers. Her strength in cognitive skills and motor abilities increase every day and proves to be working thanks to the dedicated staff at the JDCCF" states Jill Glassman, Director of Early Childhood Services for The Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families.
