

# Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families Participates in Pilot Program

The Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families continues to participate in the pilot of the Quality Rating Improvement Scales; Grow NJ Kids, test program. This past quarter the Center developed a quality improvement plan based on the outcomes of several internal environmental ratings and scoring on the pilot QRIS self assessment scale. Grow NJ Kids has presented monthly directors workshops on topics that have included: The Birth to 3 Learning Standards, The Preschool Learning Standards, further training in the Early Childhood and Infant & Toddler Development, Environmental Rating Scales (ECERS & ITERS), Preschool Classroom Mathematics Inventory (PCMI), and the Supports for Early Literacy Assessment (SELA). All of these materials and tools will be used in the classrooms and will determine future changes and improvements. In addition, a \$2,000 grant from Grow NJ Kids will help the school to purchase the materials and items that are necessary to enhance curriculum and the school environment. "This is a great opportunity to engage in a continuous quality improvement initiative" notes Associate Executive Director, Chris Corvino, "we look forward to further collaboration with the Grow NJ Kids program".

# Employment Services Expands Work and Day Options for Individuals Served

n June 23, 2014 The Arc of Somerset County announced their new Director of Employment Services, Gary Kummer, who has been with the agency for over nine years.

As the new leader of the Employment Services Department, Gary will be looking to ensure that the quality services that have been provided will continue while we also look to meet the changing needs of those we serve. Below are a few updates from the Department:

- For the fiscal year 2013-2014 the Supported Employment Department placed 15 individuals in competitive jobs in the community.
- The department is working on the on the creation of two new rooms at the Gannett and Branchburg ATC's. The rooms will have the purpose of allowing for greater flexibility during the day for those individuals who may not be focused on the contract work that is currently available. Both rooms will provide those individuals who need to have more frequent breaks and opportunity for relaxation during the day with a quite space to do so. The goal is to allow individuals with the ability to continue their day services while having the ability to address their personal needs for a more soothing environment.
- Employment Services is in the process of finalizing a contract with the town of Bound Brook to help beautify their downtown area. Two days each week 3-4 individuals from the Gannett and Valley Park ATC will collect debris along all the streets of downtown Bound Brook. The Arc has provided the same service for years in downtown Manville. "We are excited at this new opportunity for our individuals", notes Director Gary Kummer, "our goal is to ensure every individual has the option to work to the best of their ability".









# Arc Athletes Participate in Local, State and National Special Olympics


n June 15th, 2014 more than 18,000 individuals- including 3,500 Special Athletes from around the country participated in the kick off of the 2014 Special Olympics USA Games. While Athletes have competed in local and State events since 1962, there have only been 3 USA events. The first Special Olympics USA Game was in 2006 in Ames, Iowa, the second was in Lincoln, Nebraska in 2010 and this year's event was in New Jersey.

During the opening ceremony, which was held at the Prudential Center in Newark many of the athletes joined the Parade of Athletes and enjoyed words of inspiration from "Glee" actress Jane Lynch and even got a glimpse of Governor, Chris Christie who was named the honorary chair of the USA Games. New Jersey was well represented with 269 Team New Jersey member athletes.

The spirit of the games was present for our athletes at The Arc of Somerset County. Twenty two individuals participated in the NJ State Special Olympic Games that were held from May 30th to June 1st. One of our athletes brought home a gold medal in the Javelin throw. To add to the medal count, two individuals won medals in the National Games – gold in weight lifting and a bronze and silver in cycling.

Although not all athletes came home with a medal, the spirit of the games and the opportunity to pursue their personal best was the award for all of the athletes who participated.

The Special Olympics program was born out of Eunice Kennedy Shriver's mission of inclusion for those with intellectual disabilities, beginning with Camp Shriver, a summer camp she started at her Maryland farm in 1962. The motto of Special Olympics was and continues to be: "Let me win- But if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt."



- Increase community awareness about individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities
- Initiate collaborative efforts between and among other human service agencies
- Explore funding resources to meet the expanding needs of our community

It is these principles that created the foundation of our agency and they will continue to carry us for years to come.

The common thread in all of our successes is people. We are inspired by the tenacity and determination of those we serve and their families; our employees are leaders in their area of expertise and show commitment and compassion in everything they do; and our volunteers are the cornerstone of all that we accomplish.

I hope you will join us as we head into the future - strong, viable and focused on providing the supports that the children and adults we serve need to develop and achieve at every stage of life!

# The Arc of Somerset County Receives Over 1,000 Vol

The Arc of Somerset County had an exciting month of June at their very own Camp Jotoni in Warren Township where three major companies sent volunteers to help revitalize the camp grounds and buildings. These events

followed the first phase of the Camp Jotoni Capital Campaign that The Arc had put into place earlier this year in an effort to raise funds to invest in the Camp's future.



On June 6, Home Depot of Bridgewater sent eight employees to build a much needed fence around the camp's basketball court and completed gutter and flooring repairs to some of the cabins. The group returned on June 27 to install a new high traffic floor in the dining hall and performed repairs to the music pavilion roof.



On Tuesday, June 10, Henkel N.A. Corporation of Bridgewater sent ten employees to plant shrubs and flowers around the newly paved path from the music pavilion to the nature pavilion and around the camp's basketball court. The camp was in dire need of the new paving that covered mostly dirt road and grass which made it hard to navigate some of the campers who use a wheelchair for mobility. Through a \$13,000 grant from Henkel, The Arc was able to finish repaving and resurfacing work throughout the camp grounds which will help ensure safe and accessible walkway for the more than 200 children, adolescents and adults who experience the joy of Camp Jotoni.



The grant was offered by Henkel through their MIT program, (Make an Impact on Tomorrow). Henkel has long been a supporter of volunteer programs to The Arc of Somerset County. "It is great to work for a company that supports the volunteerism of its employees", stated JoAnn Artfitch, the organizer of this event and employee of Henkel Corporation who also secured the MIT Grant. "We all touch the hearts of others in ways that aren't always apparent to us. We want all of the work being done here leading up to opening day to bring smiles and joy to all who come here".



And finally, on Friday, June 13, L'Oreal Manufacturing facility based in Somerset organized a 250 employee volunteer day effort by sending their entire manufacturing plant to Camp Jotoni for the day. A large tent was erected on the grounds, a DJ played music, and breakfast and lunch was served to keep everyone energized throughout the day. L'Oreal partnered with the Grainger Foundation which helped with the project. L'Oreal covered all of the expenses related to the projects. In addition, The Grainger Foundation

presented The Arc with a \$10,000 donation for this project initiative. The Arc estimated that L'Oreal's volunteers completed over four years worth of maintenance and improvements to the camp, "This was an unprecedented event for The Arc of Somerset County", stated Lauren Panarella, Executive Director. "The generosity of time, talent, and funds has truly made an impact on Camp Jotoni and will ultimately benefit the individuals who attend the camp".

Since 1976, children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities have enjoyed spending part of their summer at Camp Jotoni. Over the years many new programs have been added to camp including residential weeks, community outings, overnight trips off camp grounds, and most recently, respite weekends during the spring and fall. Volunteer efforts such as this, which were provided by Home Depot, Henkel and L'Oreal, help to preserve the camp facilities so that The Arc can continue to provide quality services for years to come.
