Donna enjoys participating in community outings including going to the Bridgewater Mall, and eating at the Olive Garden and IHOP with her housemates. Donna is an accomplished Special Olympics athlete who participates in bowling and wheelchair races. She has won many county and state medals, including several gold medals.

as Elvis Presley's house in Memphis and riding the Tunica Queen in Mississippi. Her home is decorated with has many of her vacation photos of vacations.

Burton moved from his mom's house in his late teens into the Ardsley Group Home in 1980. He later moved to the Union Ave Supervised Apartments and finally to the Commons 2 Supervised Apartments where he has lived for the past 27 years. Although he moved out of her house, he continues to have a close and loving relationship with his mother.

Burton has held many jobs in the community over the years including positions at Merck Pharmaceuticals, Charlie Brown Restaurant, as well as an usher/cleaner at the AMC Movie Theaters in Bridgewater and janitor/cleaner at the Ranger Station in Griggstown and DMV Office in Somerville. For the past three years he has been working at The Goodwill Store putting clothes

on hangers. When not working in the community, Burton attends The Arc's Branchburg Day Hab Program where he completed contract work and now participates in the program's various activities.

Burton is a willing participant in any of the activities offered at Commons including going shopping at WalMart, attending the movies, or going out to eat. Burton wants the readers to know that he enjoys living at the Commons and interacting with the residents and staff, all whom he thinks of as friends. He also has participated in Guided Tour Vacations to Atlantic City and the Poconos, making friends with everyone he encounters with his friendly smile and warm personality.

Since 1993, Burton has been an active member of The Arc's Self-Advocacy Group - Advocates for Change. He held the office of Treasurer and has attended the bi-annual Statewide Self-Advocacy Events for many years.

In 2019 the Rutgers School of Public Health, Community Living Education Project included Burton in their annual 'A Day in the Life Of...', a short film that documents a day in the life of three individuals with disabilities. The film is meant to demonstrate that individuals with disabilities are all unique individuals with their own choices, hopes and dreams. In the Fall of 2019, Burton received the "Halo Award" at The Arc of Somerset County's Arc Angel Gala for his contributions to The Arc of Somerset County and the community at large.



When asked what he wanted the readers to know about him, Burton replied 'that I'm a good person'. All who know him would certainly agree! Congratulations Burton, we look forward hearing about to your future adventures.


## Cooking It Up with Chris & Lauren— Crock Pot Edition

# Words from Executive Staff

#### All:

We are pleased to inform that we will be formally opening opportunities to visit with loved ones in person at our residential programs and are doing so with the guidance of our state partners. To this end some important items to ensure continued safety:

- Social distancing as recommended by the CDC will be mandatory as will the use of face masks. If personal protective equipment is not available to a family we will provide it IF available
- · Visits will be limited to 2 family members at a time
- Visits will take place outside on program property only visitors must be 6 feet apart from their loved one at all times.
- Because we cannot support visits for all of our consumers at the same time we will be arranging schedules with each program on a rotating basis. We can accommodate no more than 3 visits per day and will ask that timing is respected. Visits will be set at no more than one hour in length
- For any person who may have a challenge understanding safe social distancing especially when re-connecting with loved ones, we may ask for team discussion on how best to preserve distance and safety and will ask for family understanding in any extra precautions
- Visits must be arranged through Adult Services Director Karen Kowalski to allow for scheduling and monitoring
- · Visits will begin 6/10/2020
- We are considering this our initial steps toward facilitating more contact with your loved ones. Shortly it is our hope to open more visitation times to accommodate our many families.

While we know these visits will not replace the type of contact you and your family are used to we hope it provides some comfort and uplift as we maintain the safety of our operations. We look forward to assisting in your reunions.
