The Jerry Davis Center Graduates 4 Children

n Friday, June 19th the Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families graduated 4 students from their preschool classroom. These children will be attending kindergarten in their home districts this fall. Afterward, parents and extended family gathered with the teaching staff to celebrate the successes of this past school year. The celebration included song performances by the graduates that included the song "Chibirin Chibirin" sung in Spanish and "Five Green and Speckled Frogs" and "Months of the Year".



Graduate student, Dominick recited a poem to the audience and his classmates that reflected his time at The Jerry Davis Center and the friends he made as well as the many things he learned- in particular- a favorite of his which is reading! The students received their certificates, posed for pictures, and tossed their mortar board. Afterward, there was a family friendly celebration that included game and activity centers for child and parent involvement, and a picnic that included lemonade home made by the preschool class. The Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families thanks the parents of our graduates for their trust and confidence in our teaching skills, and wishes Dominick, Cheyenne, Shane and Viktor, all the best in their future school endeavors.

How Early Intervention Programs Led to Readiness for Kindergarten

In 2013, Michelle, was concerned about her son Dominick's oral and motor development as well as his inability to accept texture of foods and chewing. As a quiet child, Dominick was also struggling with certain social skills, such as sharing with other children and overall play interaction.

Dominick was evaluated for the Early Intervention (EI) Program at 18 months and was found to be eligible for services. The Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families EI Program provided the occupational services that were recommended by the evaluation team. These weekly Early Intervention Servcies helped Dominick progress to age appropriate levels in all developmental areas by the time he graducated from the EI Program at the age of 3.

Michelle felt Dominick's socialization and play interaction with other children, as well as his eating habits would not have improved if it weren't for the Early Intervention Services he received from The Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families.

"Dominick has grown to be a leader in his class and has developed empathy for students he sees may be struggling with socializing and physical play", stated Michelle "It is such an amazing accomplishment to see his progress to see him graduate and be so ready for Kindergarten"



he Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families continues to participate in the pilot of the Quality Rating Improvement Scales; GrowNJ Kids, test program. This spring, the Center utilized funding from the \$10,000 grant and were able to purchase materials for the pre-school center and various assessment tools. These items have enhanced the pre-school curriculum and have helped Center Director, Jennifer Orlick develop a quality improvement plan based on the outcomes of several internal and environmental ratings and scoring on

Ctop & Shop awarded The Jerry Davis Center for Children and Families a grant for \$1,000 this spring. The program was kicked off on April 22nd at the Stop & Shop in Raritan as the Assistant General Manager, Bill Gulden and store employee, Tammy Weber greeted the preschool children who took a field trip to the Raritan store to learn about the variety of and the colors of fruits and vegetables that the produce department offers.

The grant was used

to support the Developmental Daycare and Preschool "Veggies and Fruit Friends" program which helped bring nutrition education interactively to the students with curriculum activities such as 'Veggie Market Stand Days''. In preparation for the market day event, the students purchased fresh veggies and fruit, cut them up and placed them into baggies to sell to staff at the Manville office.



The Arc of Somerset County to Launch "The Achievement Center" at Raritan Valley Community College

The Arc of Somerset County is proud to announce a new partnership with Raritan Valley Community College and The Arc of Hunterdon County. "The Achievement Center" at Raritan Valley College is a three year post secondary educational program for students recently graduated from their high school program. The Center, which will pilot enrollment this Fall semester will offer advanced experience in preparation for greater or more sophisticated employment outcomes as well as exposure to accessible college courses in the liberal arts and integrated exposure to college life. Students will



attend classes designed to create both a college education and career plan while gaining access to the social and interpersonal experience of a busy college campus. Physical education will be consistently offered throughout the program with the goal of fully integrating into at least one college sport or club activity. Students will have the chance to work with a peer mentor and join increasingly more integrated subject classes as the three year program progresses. As part of The Arc of Somerset County's Employment Services Department,

The Achievement Center will bring the assessments, job exploration and preparation activities typically associated with the job search process into an academic environment to allow students to develop their preferences and skills at a level that offers both more time and depth for those interested while work continues on supporting skills such as functional and educational reading and mathematics.



Courses and practice time for the advanced social environment of an independent college campus will allow students to develop the confidence and personal skills necessary for more naturally supported employment settings. Beyond work, The Achievement Center hopes to expand upon students' capacity for lifelong learning and provide a supported space to continue education at an advanced level where typical school entitlements would otherwise end.

We are pleased to say that Raritan Valley Community College has been an eager partner both philosophically and logistically, pledging space and access to its many programs and facilities. The program is just another step towards the full inclusion of our students with disabilities into their community and academic institutions. "We applaud Raritan Valley Community College and our other partners in being both progressive and innovative in their commitment to serving a diverse college population" states Lauren Panarella Executive Director of The Arc of Somerset County.
